

New Zealand College of Sexual and Reproductive Health (NZCSRH) – Progress on required actions

The NZCSRH underwent an accreditation assessment as a New Zealand training provider of vocational medical training and recertification programmes on 6, 7 and 8 July 2022.

The overall outcome of the assessment for the NZCSRH's accreditation was '**not met**', and, as a result, the NZCSRH is not accredited as a vocational training provider.

The outcome of the assessment for the NZCSRH accreditation as a recertification programme provider was '**substantially met**'.

The NZCSRH is currently accredited as a recertification programme provider until 31 December 2024, subject to satisfactorily addressing the required actions listed below.
